
The Mitten is a project for the Tiny Weaver Looms or for the Multis.






The size will vary with your yarn. I've used handspun bulky Lincoln wool and the mittens fit my husband's hands and were a bit long for mine. I've also used a woolen spun, finer yarn with quite a bit of elasticity which made a mitten that would fit me but also my 10 year old grandson, whose hands are a bit smaller than mine.


I made these mittens on the 7" Quilt Weaver looms with wool and they felted nicely as an oven mitt. A bit stiff for mittens, but that was just toss them in the washer and see what happens, a more controlled felting might give better results. It is fun to experiment.

Make 7 squares and 2 triangles of worsted weight or bulky wool yarn. Sew together following chart . **Thumb**: Sew in place in seam, remembering to sew one side to the upper half and the other to the lower half so the thumb is open.

To make the cuff, cast on 28 stitches and work k2 p2 for 1 1/2 or 2". Or you may crochet a cuff or weave two more squares and sew onto bottom to form a gauntlet. To make the other mitten, follow the above directions, reversing the side that the thumb is sewn into. You don't want two left hands!



I don't know why they want you to use the 2" loom. As you can see the 4" will work just fine for the body of the mitten. Use the two inch to make their thumb.

E Q U I P M E N T AND MATERIALS

1 JUNIOR WEAVE-IT 1 OZ. KNITTING WORSTED

1 PR. No. 3 KNITTING NEEDLES

Weave thirty-six Junior squares. Assemble as shown in diagram leaving an opening on one square on the outside edge of each mitten. To make thumb sew three squares together. Fold in half on the dotted line. Sew up both sides leaving the bottom open and gathering the top. Insert thumb into the opening in the main part of the mitten and sew on. At the bottom of the mitten pick up approximately thirty-two stitches and knit 2, purl 2 for cuff making it any desired length. Embroider a flower on the middle of each of the four squares on the back of the mitten. Fold in half the wrong way making sure that the thumb is in the correct position. Sew up side and top gathering the top as much as possible. Turn right side out and press.

For crocheted edge mitten. Weave thirtysix Junior squares using the weave on p. 19 of the Weave-It Weaves Booklet. Assemble as shown in diagram for regular mitten. When making thumb, instead of sewing together, crochet one row single crochet around outside edge gathering in at the top. Insert thumb the same as in regular mitten. Knit cuff and fold the long way and single crochet one row all around the outside edge of the mitten. Embroider lazy daisies in any desirable place on the back. Press. Shetland Floss is preferred for the embroidery and crocheting.
